Making a Difference

- Camp To Belong Georgia (CTB-GA) strives to give siblings in care the opportunity to strengthen the relationship that is typically the longest in life—the one with their brothers and sisters.
- Our purpose is to reunite siblings placed in separate foster homes or other out-of-home care for events that will strengthen them emotionally and build their social skills, encourage them to adopt a positive outlook, allow them to cut loose and have fun and foster their sibling connection.
- Camp To Belong hopes to serve as the catalyst for system-changing solutions regarding sibling policy, recruitment of foster and adoptive families for siblings and best practices among child welfare professionals.

Helping Georgia's Children in Care

- Of the over 15,000 youth in foster care in Georgia, 50% of them are separated from at least one sibling.
- Nearly 25 children from across the state spent the week with their brothers and sisters at CTB-GA's inaugural camp in 2008. Camp dates for 2011 are from June 19 - June 24, 2011.
- Counselors who volunteer to serve at camp come from all walks of life. They are social workers, nurses, retirees and other professionals with a love for children. For every 2 campers, CTB-GA recruits one counselor to become a part of their camp family.



The Camp To Belong Experience

- Brothers and sisters in care come together in a safe, nurturing, week-long summer camp environment where they can create childhood memories together. CTB-GA camp is provided to attendees free of charge.
- Each summer camp provides intentional signature programming designed to fortify the sibling bond. These programs include Art Expression, Sibling Enhancement, and Life Seminar and Mentoring.
- Rather than being grouped by age, CTB groups campers by family so that siblings spend the most time together possible, participating in activities that will foster relationship-building.
